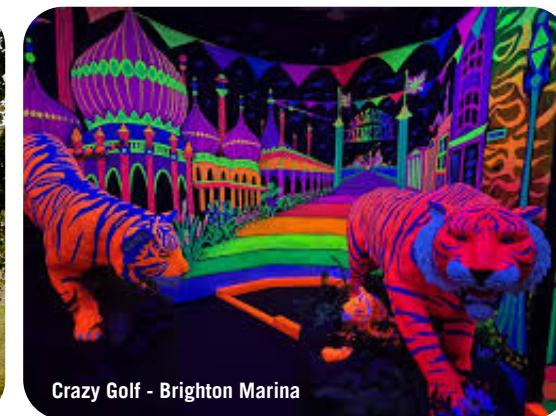

# Wednesday Excursions 2026

## ENGLISH PLUS & ENGLISH FOR THE FUTURE, LANCING

1st July	<p><b>Out of Bounds: High Ropes &amp; Adventure Golf</b></p> <p>This excursion offers a high-energy, interactive day where students can challenge themselves on the high ropes and enjoy a relaxed social round of adventure golf.</p>
8th July	<p><b>Brighton Royal Pavilion</b></p> <p>This exotic palace, built as a seaside home for King George IV, features a unique design with Indian-style domes and towers. Students will see the spectacular Chinese-inspired decorations and royal furnishings.</p>
15th July	<p><b>Go Ape Crawley Forest Adventures and High Ropes</b></p> <p>Located in Tilgate Park, this trip involves navigating high-ropes, wobbly bridges and a Treetop Adventure in beautiful woodland close to Crawley. Students will test their courage at the Treetop Challenge.</p>
22nd July	<p><b>Arundel Castle</b></p> <p>A visit to one of the great castles of England, built by William the Conqueror's cousin, will allow the students to explore the extensive Collector Earl's Garden and climb up the steep steps for views of the River Arun.</p>
29th July	<p><b>Brighton Marina and Indoor Crazy Golf</b></p> <p>A visit to Brighton Marina, Brighton's entertainment hub, where students will be able to stroll around the waterfront and play glow-in-the-dark indoor mini golf at Globalls featuring truly unique themed courses in UV light.</p>
5th August	<p><b>Out of Bounds: Zip Lines &amp; Bowling</b></p> <p>This excursion combines the physical thrill of zip lining with the social, relaxed fun of bowling. It is an ideal excursion for students to build confidence and bond through a mix of high-energy challenges.</p>
12th August	<p><b>Brighton Pier &amp; Seafront</b></p> <p>This excursion takes students to Brighton Pier and the lively seafront for a fun-filled day by the sea. Students will explore traditional seaside attractions and experience the vibrant coastal atmosphere.</p>

<p>4th July</p>	<p><b>London Eye &amp; Covent Garden</b> A 30-minute flight at 135 metres on the London Eye, the world's tallest observation wheel, provides a panoramic view of the city's skyline, followed by a walking tour to Covent Garden, where students can watch famous street performers in the Piazza and explore the shops in the historic Apple Market.</p>
<p>11th July</p>	<p><b>London: Westminster Walking Tour &amp; Oxford Street</b> This excursion begins with a walking tour of Westminster to see iconic British landmarks including Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament, and Westminster Abbey. Afterwards, students continue to Oxford Street, Europe's busiest shopping road, to explore famous flagship stores like Selfridges.</p>
<p>18th July</p>	<p><b>London: Madame Tussauds &amp; Westminster Walking Tour</b> A visit to Madame Tussauds involves meeting lifelike wax figures of world-famous celebrities, sporting legends and the British Royal Family. This is followed by a walking tour of Westminster to see iconic London landmarks including Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament and Westminster Abbey.</p>
<p>25th July</p>	<p><b>London: Thames River Cruise</b> A boat trip along the River Thames offers a clear view of landmarks like the Tower of London, the London Eye, Westminster Houses of Parliament and Big Ben.</p>
<p>1st August</p>	<p><b>London: Natural History Museum</b> A visit to the museum includes examining the huge blue whale skeleton and the first T-Rex fossil ever discovered, as well as a walk through the Earth Hall to see meteorites from outer space, the world's largest gold nugget, and a realistic earthquake simulator.</p>
<p>8th August</p>	<p><b>London Eye &amp; Covent Garden</b> A 30-minute flight at 135 metres on the London Eye, the world's tallest observation wheel, provides a panoramic view of the city's skyline, followed by a walking tour to Covent Garden, where students can watch famous street performers in the Piazza and explore the shops in the historic Apple Market.</p>

# Sunday Excursions 2026

5th July	<b>Thorpe Park</b> A visit to the UK's most thrilling theme park with over 25 rides which involves experiencing some of the UK's tallest and fastest rollercoasters such as the Hyperia and the Swarm, getting soaked on the Tidal Wave, and discovering various immersive attractions.
12th July	<b>Windsor Castle</b> A visit to the world's oldest and largest occupied castle includes a tour of the State Apartments, which are decorated with famous paintings and royal treasures. The excursion also features St George's Chapel, the burial place of many monarchs, and the opportunity to watch the Changing of the Guards.
19th July	<b>Portsmouth Historic Dockyard &amp; Gunwharf Quays</b> A visit to Portsmouth Historic Dockyard involves exploring famous warships like the HMS Victory, Lord Nelson's flagship during the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805. The trip continues to Gunwharf Quays, a modern waterfront area where students can observe the Spinnaker Tower and explore the designer outlet shops.
26th July	<b>Canterbury Cathedral</b> A visit to this UNESCO Heritage site involves exploring the medieval architecture, learning about its 1,400-year history and visiting the spot where Thomas Becket was famously murdered in 1170.
2nd August	<b>Thorpe Park</b> A visit to the UK's most thrilling theme park with over 25 rides which involves experiencing some of the UK's tallest and fastest rollercoasters such as the Hyperia and the Swarm, getting soaked on the Tidal Wave, and discovering various immersive attractions.
9th August	<b>Port Lympne Safari Park</b> A truck safari across the vast African and Asian reserves will allow the students to observe free-roaming animals like giraffes, zebras, rhinos, lions, tigers, gorillas, monkeys and bears. This is followed by a walking tour of the Gorilla Trail to see the world's largest collection of Western Lowland Gorillas.
