<p>8th July</p>	<p>Brighton: i360, Seafront and Shopping A flight in the Brighton i360 glass pod provides a 360-degree view of the Sussex Coastline, the South Downs and the city from 138 metres in the air. This is followed by a walk along the pebbled Brighton Beach and shopping time to explore the Lanes, Brighton's historic heart filled with independent shops and hidden squares.</p>
<p>15th July</p>	<p>Herstmonceux Observatory Science Centre Housed in the former home of the Royal Greenwich Observatory, this centre is dedicated to science and astronomical history. The visit includes interactive exhibits as well as access to the historic telescope domes.</p>
<p>22nd July</p>	<p>Out of Bounds: Bowling and Adventure Nets This excursion to Out of Bounds in Angmering is an action-packed day designed to get students out of the classroom and into a high-energy social environment. The trip combines the physical thrill of navigating high-altitude nets with the classic, friendly competition of ten-pin bowling, offering a well-rounded experience that balances outdoor adventure with indoor fun.</p>
<p>29th July</p>	<p>Out of Bounds: Clip n Climb and Adventure Golf This excursion combines the physical thrill of vertical climbing with the social, relaxed fun of adventure golf. It is an ideal excursion for students to build confidence and bond through a mix of high-energy challenge and friendly competition.</p>
<p>5th August</p>	<p>Tulleys Farm Tulleys is a world-famous family-run farm in West Sussex that transforms from a traditional agricultural site into a large adventure park. The visit involves exploring 12 acres of vibrant sunflower fields and capturing memories at over 25 unique photo stations including vintage cars and giant sunglasses.</p>

<p>11th July</p>	<p>London: British Museum & Oxford Street This trip offers the perfect London experience: a morning immersed in the ancient secrets of the British Museum examining world-famous historical objects like the Rosetta Stone and the Elgin Marbles, followed by an afternoon of high-energy shopping in London's busiest shopping district.</p>
<p>18th July</p>	<p>London Eye and Westminster Walking Tour A 30-minute flight at 135 metres on the London Eye, the world's tallest observation wheel, provides a panoramic view of the city's skyline, followed by a walking tour of Parliament Square, through St James' Park to Buckingham Palace.</p>
<p>25th July</p>	<p>London: Thames River Cruise and Westminster A boat trip along the River Thames offers a clear view of landmarks like the Tower of London, the London Eye and Big Ben. This is followed by a walking tour of Parliament Square and Whitehall to see the Houses of Parliament and the guards at Horse Guards Parade.</p>
<p>1st August</p>	<p>London: Natural History Museum A visit to the museum includes examining the huge blue whale skeleton and the first T-Rex fossil ever discovered, as well as a walk through the Earth Hall to see meteorites from outer space, the world's largest gold nugget, and a realistic earthquake simulator.</p>

<p>12th July</p>	<p>Chessington World of Adventures A trip to Chessington World of Adventures is a highlight of the social programme, offering an exhilarating day of fun at one of the UK's premier theme parks. With over 40 rides and attractions spread across uniquely themed lands—such as the World of Jumanji and Wild Asia—there is an adventure suited to every bravery level.</p>
<p>19th July</p>	<p>Windsor Castle A visit to the world's oldest and largest occupied castle includes a tour of the State Apartments, which are decorated with famous paintings and royal treasures. The excursion also features St George's Chapel, the burial place of many monarchs, and the opportunity to watch the Changing of the Guard ceremony on the castle grounds.</p>
<p>26th July</p>	<p>Portsmouth Historic Dockyard & Gunwharf Quays A visit to Portsmouth Historic Dockyard involves exploring famous warships like the HMS Victory, Lord Nelson's flagship during the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805. The trip continues to Gunwharf Quays, a modern waterfront area where students can observe the Spinnaker Tower and explore the designer outlet shops.</p>
<p>2nd August</p>	<p>Brighton Sea Life The visit involves observing exotic marine life and walking through the glass ocean tunnel to see sharks and turtles. This is followed by a walk along the historic Brighton Pier to visit the traditional amusements and view the coastal scenery.</p>
